

### Extension Activity for TOM'S SPECIAL TALENT by Kate Gaynor

### **Objectives:**

- Students will understand that they each have a special talent as well as activities that are challenging for them.
- Students will have a deeper understanding of dyslexia by hearing Tom's story.

Materials: Copy of <u>Tom's Special Talent</u>

Time: 30 minutes

# Activity:

# Option 1:

- 1. Read Tom's Special Talent aloud to the class.
- 2. Ask students to think about their own special talents and pick one that is important to them.
- 3. Have students stand up in a circle.
- 4. Go around the circle and have each student say their name and talent while acting it out (i.e. pantomime drawing, throwing a ball, dancing, etc.)
- 5. After the student says their name and does their pantomime, have the other students repeat their name and the action. Do this for each student.

### Option 2:

- 1. Read <u>Tom's Special Talent</u> aloud to the class.
- 2. Partner students up.
- 3. Ask the students to tell their partner about their special talent and why they like the activity.
- 4. Go around the circle and have partners introduce the other person's talent (i.e. "This is Sarah her talent is ice skating. She practices every week.")
